



Information for passengers arriving to Turkey from abroad

In accordance with the measures taken by Republic of Turkey Ministry of Health, passengers arriving to Turkey from abroad are required to have taken a PCR test with a negative result within 72 hours prior to their scheduled flight departure as of December 30, 2020 (at midnight) in the country of departure, and the test result should be submitted during check-in. The test should be a Nucleic acid test. Passengers below 6 years of age are not required to submit a test result.

Transit passengers are not required to submit a PCR test in Turkey however they are advised to review the flight restrictions applied by the destination country regarding the PCR test requirements, age limits and the duration.

Passengers failing to submit a digital or paper copy of a negative PCR test result are not permitted to board the flights.

In addition to the requirement of presenting a negative test result done in the last 72 hours, those who have arrived in Turkey from the UK, Denmark and South Africa in the past 10 days will be asked to present a negative test result done within the past 72 hours, and also will be required to quarantine in where they are staying. If the second test which will be done on the seventh day of their quarantine comes out negative, their quarantine will be over, and if they test positive, they will receive treatment.
